OVERVIEW OF ROLE

The Culture & Diversity Officer takes a lead on championing diversity and lobbying the university on student integration and widening participation. You'd be making sure the needs of the diverse student body are represented; ensuring excellent support is available for all students. Campaigning for equality, and for a University where individuality is celebrated and where self-expression is encouraged.

As Culture & Diversity Officer, you would be one of the Students' Union four Sabbatical Officers responsible for representing students at University of the Arts London and helping to initiate change within the University. The Sabbatical Officers head up the Union, acting as Trustees of the organisation and taking a lead on major campaigns, strategic developments, projects and events. You will act as an advocate of the Students' Union, supporting involved students, protecting student welfare, promoting student activities, and working to improve the student experience.

In addition to role specific responsibilities, Sabbatical Officers decide collectively who will lead on certain other projects and areas; i.e. – ethical & environmental work, sexual health awareness campaigns, work with Halls of Residence, large scale exhibitions, the Buddying scheme, Fresher's activities, SU Bars & online shop.

Length of Opportunity

If elected you will hold the post from 15th July 2010 to 14th July 2011. Before this date, it is likely that you will work with current officers on some projects and you will be required to go through a period of 'handover'.

The Working Week

You will be expected to work at least 37 hours a week including our core office hours of 10am – 5pm. There are a number of occasions when you will be required to work outside of these hours; meeting students, attending events or conferences. You will be entitled to take 25 days annual leave as well as bank holidays throughout the year.

Location

Your usual place of work will be at the Universities Central Building in Holborn, Central London but you will frequently need to work at and attend events at all sites of the University. You will also be required to travel to a number of nationally organised training, conference and networking events across London & the UK.

Money, Money, Money

The Culture & Diversity Officer role is a full-time position for one year and attracts a living allowance of just over £21,600.

What you will be doing

As Culture & Diversity Officer you'd regularly attend liaise with UAL departments relevant to your role, eg; Widening Participation, Student Services, Diversity and International Centre. You'd work closely with Student Reps from underrepresented and disadvantaged groups, linking with NUS liberation campaigns and external organisations. You could get involved with organising events like; language exchanges, speed networking, Activists training days, Black History Month celebrations, World Aids Day, International Womens Day, Disability Arts Exhibitions.

You will get access to training and development programmes offered in house by the Students' Union and the University and also externally by the National Union of Students and other relevant organisations.

REQUIREMENTS / RESTRICTIONS ...

No previous experience is required, but lots of enthusiasm and a willingness to learn are essential.

Due to the Trustee aspect of this opportunity and the nature of that role, you can not have been convicted of an offence involving deception or dishonesty (unless the conviction is spent) and you can not have a history of bankruptcy. Before the voting period starts you must hand in a signed 'TRUSTEE DECLARATION OF ELIGIBILITY' which can be found at www.suarts.org/trusteedeclaration

To take on this role you must stand in an election against other potential candidates from across University of the Arts London. The winner of the post will be decided by a vote in which all UAL students are invited to take part. To stand in the election you must currently be a Full-Member of the Students' Union – i.e. a fully enrolled student at University of the Arts London.
